It currently resides in the Exhibition Hall of the National Archive in Washington, D.C.

The Declaration of Independence was not signed by all representatives until August 1776. To make it official, John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress signed it. That is where the saying "put your John Hancock on it" came from.

Thank you for giving your pillar officers the chance to represent us in this retreat.




